

Management of sexual contacts of a person diagnosed with Chlamydia

Dear Dr
May we suggest that you screen for chlamydia, gonorrhoea, and other sexually transmissible infections, including pharyngeal and/or rectal swabs as indicated plus serology for syphilis, hepatitis B, and HIV.
New Zealand guidelines recommend empiric treatment of sexual partners, irrespective of negative test results.
Treatment is with Azithromycin 1.0 grams orally as a stat dose or Doxycycline 100mg twice a day for 1 week plus Condoms.
Gonorrhoea or Chlamydia diagnosed on testing should be treated appropriately. See NZ Sexual Health Society <u>www.nzshs.org.</u>
Abstinence from sexual intercourse is recommended until 1 week after both partners have been treated.
