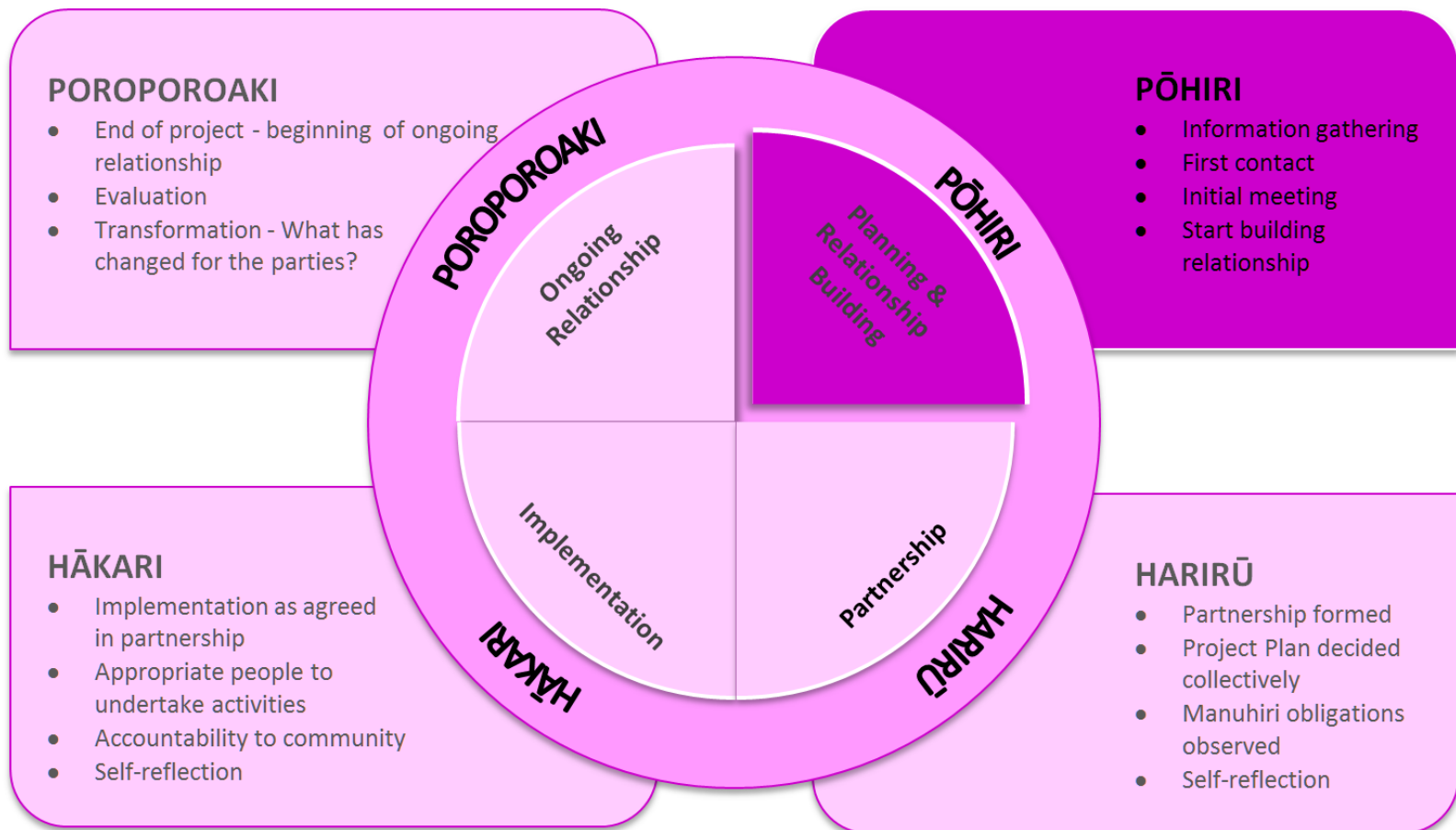

The Pōhiri model of respectful engagement and transformation



Best practice guidelines

Pōhiri model:

- ◆ Encourages respectful, positive engagement
- ◆ Emphasises partnership (Equality)
- ◆ Helps build cultural competency (Quality of care)
- ◆ Transformative (Accountability)
